ASSAM: A COMPREHENSIVE OVERVIEW

Geographical Position

Assam is located in the northeastern region of India, nestled in the Brahmaputra and Barak River valleys. It is surrounded by Arunachal Pradesh to the north, Nagaland and Manipur to the east, Meghalaya, Tripura, Mizoram, and West Bengal to the south and west, and shares international borders with Bhutan and Bangladesh.

Importance

Assam is strategically important due to its location as a gateway to the northeastern states of India. It is renowned for its rich biodiversity, vast tea plantations, and significant oil and natural gas reserves. Assam also plays a crucial role in India's connectivity with Southeast Asia.

International Border

Assam shares its international border with Bhutan to the north and Bangladesh to the south and southwest. The border with Bhutan is approximately 267 kilometers long, while the border with Bangladesh stretches around 263 kilometers.

International Border Districts

The districts in Assam that share borders with Bangladesh were Dhubri, South Salmara-Mankachar, Cachar and Karimganj. Districts bordering with Bhutan are Kokrajhar, Chirang, Tamulpur, Udalguri and Baksa.

Population

As of the 2011 census, Assam has a population of over 31 million people. The state is known for its diverse demographic composition, including various ethnic groups, languages, and cultures.

Livelihood

The primary livelihood in Assam is agriculture, with tea cultivation being a prominent industry. Other significant economic activities include handloom weaving, fishing, and the extraction of oil and natural gas.

Weather

Assam experiences a humid subtropical climate with heavy monsoon rains from June to September, mild winters, and hot, humid summers. The state's weather is greatly influenced by the Brahmaputra River, which often causes seasonal flooding.

International Border Guarding Forces

The Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB) is responsible for guarding the border with Bhutan, while the Border Security Force (BSF) secures the border with Bangladesh. These forces play a vital role in maintaining the security and sovereignty of the region.

FLOOD RELIEF

The entire populace of border areas in many districts of Assam have been entirely submerged in flood water and thereby putting thousands of families in horrendous situation with no shelter, food or drinking water. Having no place to stay, people are spending night after night on the roads. The situation was more acute with the domesticated animals due to the non-availability of cattle food.

a) Flag off program of flood relief: on 26/05/2022 a flood relief consignment containing food, water, medicine, clothes, cow feed, daily essential items for Cachar and Dima Hasao district was flagged off at Indira Gandhi athletics Stadium, Guwahati. The flood relief activities were organized by Seemanta Chetana Mancha Purvottar in association with The Hans Foundation. Smt. Queen Ojha, Hon'ble MP, Guwahati graced the occasion as the Chief Guest and Sri Diganta Barah, IPS, Home Secretary, Govt. of Assam was the Guest of Honor and Sri Mrigen Sarania, Mayor GMC was the Distinguished Guest in the program.







b) Distribution of flood relief in Cachar & Dima Hasao Districts - On May 29, 2022 flood relief materials were sent from Guwahati, Assam in association with HANS Foundation were repackaged in carry bags containing essential items like puffed rice, beaten rice, pulses, spices,salt, tea, sugar, potato, onion, candles, match boxes, detol, washing powder, soap, etc in Silchar and sent to be distributed among the flood victims of Haflong and the affected people living on the Indo-bangladesh border of Cachar district, Assam. A Total of 1650 families were given relief material including the border areas and some parts of Silchar town. Also 300 families of border areas of Katigirah were given Tarpaulin (roof shed). In addition, 1200 families of Dima Hasao District were also covered in the relief programs.


KNOW OUR SEEMANTA - A SOCIAL MEDIA CAMPAIGN

INTRODUCTION ON THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF BORDER STUDIES (NIBS)



Just like a mother protects a child from all adversaries, in a similar manner it is felt that borders of any country are like a mother that protects its citizens and ensures security within its boundaries. In a country like India which shares its boundary with seven other countries and has a varied topography with desert on the western frontier, coastal areas on the southern frontier and hilly terrains on the eastern and northern frontiers, border management is very

crucial and essential. Although there are many government agencies which work for the border area management, there are also many nonprofit organizations within India who are doing signal work for the management of border areas. Noteworthy amongst these organizations are Seemanta Chetana Mancha Purvottar (SCMP).

On 31st March 1985, in the city of Jodhpur, Rajasthan Seemanta Chetana Mancha was established on the day of Ram Navami, foreseeing the need to protect the borders of the motherland by the people with the tools of education, empowerment, unity and awareness spread among the communities residing in these border areas. Based on these ideals, a similar organization named Seemanta Chetana Mancha Purvottar (SCMP) was established on the day of Ram Navami paralleled on the 13th of April 2008 in Assam. Since then, 'Seemanta Chetana Mancha: Purvottar' is in service at the border areas of North-East India. The organization is committed to nation building process primarily with the people from the International Border Areas of the whole of Northeastern Region. The organization maintains that the International Border Areas of our country are to be safe and secure for the highest order of peace, amity and development among the citizens.

One of this organizations long cherished objective has been the establishment of a Border study institute of National repute for conducting various research and studies of the international borders as well as national borders and help the government also in taking policy level decisions. With this view in mind a formal step was taken in initiating the formation of a border study center in Guwahati by the name of "National Institute of Border Studies (NIBS)" on 27th November 2022 under the aegis of Seemanta Chetna Manch Purvottar and under the visionary guidance of Akhil Bharatiya Saha-Samyojak of Seema Jagaran Manch, Shri Pradeepan ji.

A few broad objectives of the National Institute of Border Studies are:

- 1. Tracing the origin and history of people residing in border areas.
- 2. Aiding the government in formulating policies to settle any dispute regarding border demarcation.
- Studying existing trade practices and infrastructure between countries in the international borders.
- 4. Analise the prospects of border trade between countries.
- Ensure security and safety of India's international border with dialogue and diplomacy.
- Explore the possibility of promotion of border tourism.
- Cultural exchange between citizens in the border areas.
- 8. Development of infrastructure around border areas.
- Implementation of Act East policy in true spirit.

The scope of this institute, though not limited, is as below:

- 1. Undergraduate and Post graduate programs
- Phd. Programs
- 3. Certificate courses
- Research and projects
- 5. International conferences and Seminars
- 6. Panel discussions.
- 7. Organizing academic conclaves.

NIBS is an institute formed with an objective of having in-depth study and research-based knowledge about both the international and interstate border areas of India. Since borders of a country act like a safe cocoon for the residents of a country, having a clear perspective about India's international and interstate borders is the prime motive of NIBS along with sensitization of the Indian citizens and their role as Indian citizens, residing in the border areas of our country.

Administrative Structure:

The state is divided into administrative units such as districts, blocks, and villages. At the top of the administrative hierarchy is the Chief Minister, who heads the state government. The state has its own legislature, known as the Arunachal Pradesh Legislative Assembly, with 60 seats. The Governor represents the central government in the state. Arunachal Pradesh is divided into 25 districts, each under the jurisdiction of a Deputy Commissioner (DC). Some of the prominent districts include Tawang, West Kameng, East Kameng, Papum Pare, Lower Subansiri, Upper Subansiri, West Siang, East Siang, Changlang, and Tirap, among others. Each district has its unique cultural and geographical characteristics.

Population and Indigenous Groups:

Arunachal Pradesh has a diverse population comprising various indigenous tribes and communities. The state shares borders with Assam, Nagaland, and Manipur. These inter-state borders facilitate trade, cultural exchanges, and connectivity within the northeastern region of India.










NAGALAND: A COMPREHENSIVE OVERVIEW

Nagaland shares its international border with Myanmar, boasting the country's smallest international border line. However, this porous border serves as a primary gateway for illegal activities. Among Nagaland's 17 districts, four, including Mon, Noklak, Phek, and Kiphire, share their borders with Myanmar.

Border with Other States

Nagaland shares its borders with Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, and Manipur. These inter-state borders are crucial for trade, transportation, and cultural exchanges, contributing to regional development and integration.

Border Outposts (BOPs) Guarded by Assam Rifles in Nagaland

Enhancing Transportation and Strengthening Capabilities for Border Village Tours


